The expected projects under consideration include: Finance: lending to women is seen as riskier, so they face prohibitive interest rates. In addition, women often lack traditional collateral and guarantees. Capacity: financial institutions lack the capacity to understand and respond appropriately to women entrepreneurs, who also often lack the financial and business acumen to respond to the needs of financial institutions. Business environment: in many countries, legal and regulatory frameworks hinder women's full participation in private sector growth.
