In the absence of a formal strategy on Aid4Trade, the Strategic Concept of Portuguese Cooperation 2014-2020 aims to strengthen synergies with the private sector, investment and trade, while referring to trade and finance as priority areas for policy coherence for development (PCD). In this national framework document for development cooperation, trade is particularly linked to the priority "Rural development and the sea", within the scope of Portuguese cooperation support for integrated and sustainable development models, aimed at strengthening local institutions and communities (including, for example, support for increased production in a sustainable way and promotion of access and improvements in the functioning of markets). It is also linked to education for development strategies where policy coherence for development, fair trade, responsible consumption, solidarity economy and social justice are approached. In national commitments on PCD (Council of Ministers Resolution no. 82/2010, of 4 November), Portugal has identified as particularly relevant sectoral policies on trade, finance, climate change, sea, food security, rural development, migrations and security, all of which are directly and/or indirectly addressed by EU member states' commitments. The document clearly states that close coordination between the various public policies, such as the trade policy, supports development objectives.
