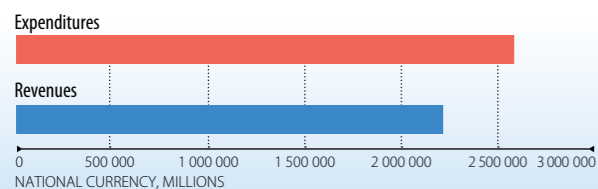

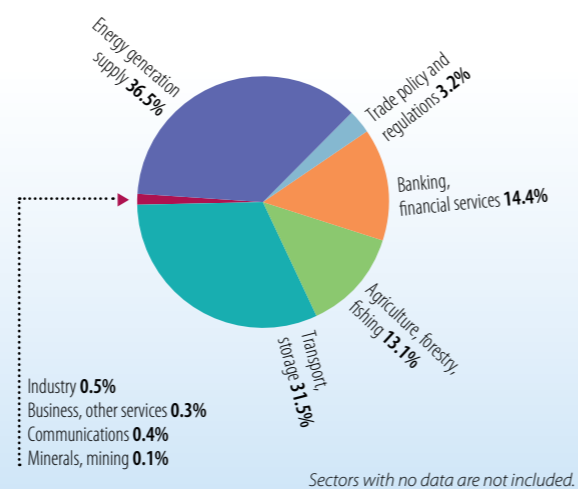

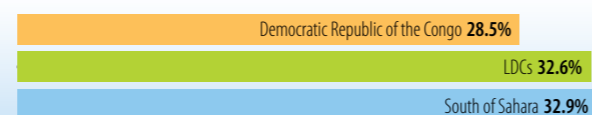

The EIF focal point and committee are involved in overseeing the trade agenda.

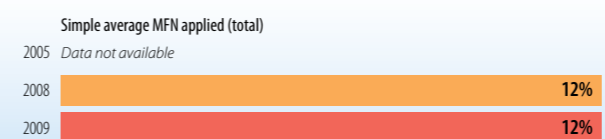
The EIF has had a significant impact on the ability to mainstream trade in the national development plan.

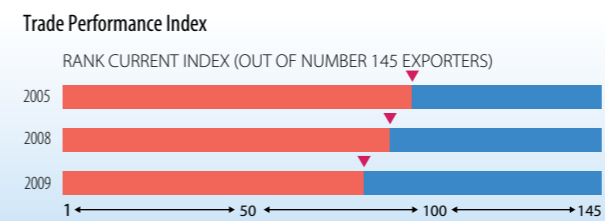

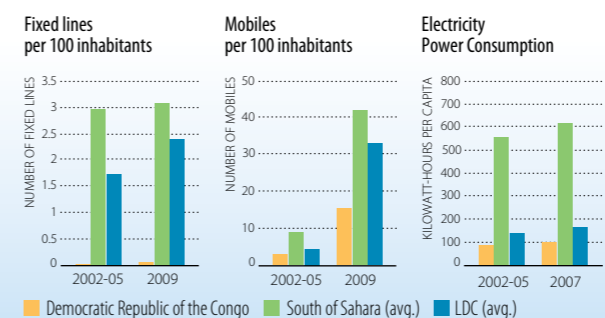

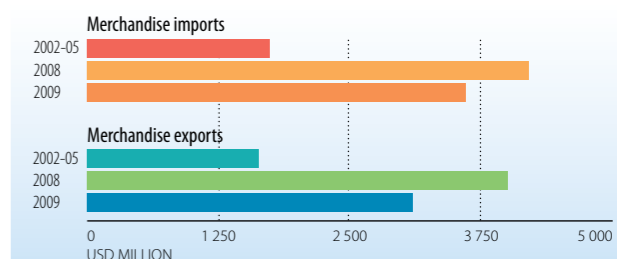

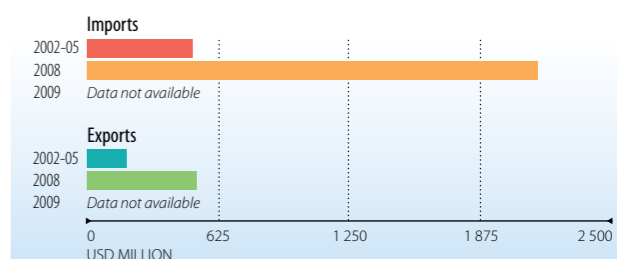
