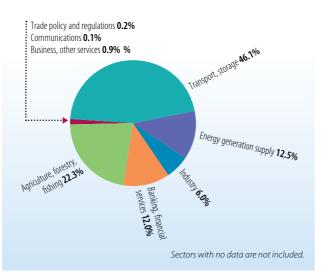

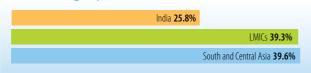

BY SECTOR (Share in total AFT, commitments, 2009)



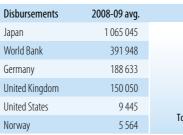
SHARE IN ODA (Commitments, 2008-09 avg.) AFT share in sector allocable ODA compared to its re

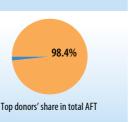
AFT share in sector allocable ODA compared to its region and income group shares

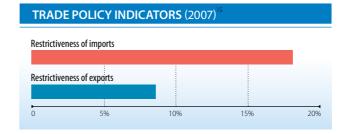

Trade is fully mainstreamed in the national development plan.



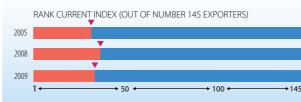

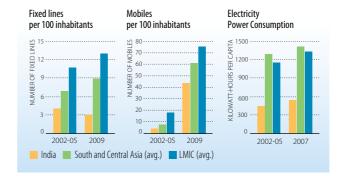


PRIORITY 2: COMPETITIVENESS¹⁷

Trade Performance Index



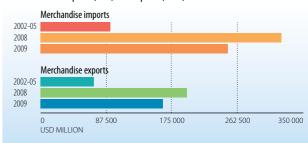

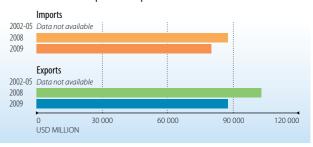

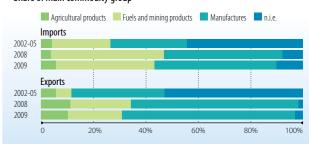

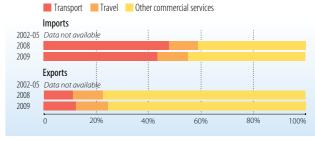
