WOHNSCHIRM – a program to prevent evictions

- June 2020: Expiration of pandemic-related eviction ban
 - → To prevent an increase in evictions, the Federal Government launched WOHNSCHIRM.
- Costs of prevention are significantly lower than costs of evictions and homelessness.
- Budget of 164 Mio. Euro for the years 2021 to 2026

How does the WOHNSCHIRM program work?

- **29 counseling centres** in all federal provinces provide social work counselling and support with the application process
- Two types of financial support:
 - Assumption of rent arrears that enables tenants to maintain their housing or
 - Lump-sum support payment that enables tenants to move into an affordable dwelling
- On behalf ot the Ministry of Social Affairs, a NGO checks the applications and initiates the payment of benefits ("Abwicklungsstelle").
- Since January 2023: additional support in case of problems with energy costs

WOHNSCHIRM: facts & figures

- 6.657 households/ 15.140 persons have received financial support
 - 5.943 apartments secured
 - 714 support for change of residence
- More than **21 Mio. Euro** in benefits paid out.
- 54% of all supported adults are women.

Housing First Austria - arriving home ("zuhause ankommen")

- The project, funded by the Ministry of Social Affairs,
 - connects social service organizations with the limited-profit housing sector.
 - arranges permanent and affordable housing for people experiencing homelessness or are at imminent risk therof.
 - operates according to Housing First principles.
- Tenants' up-front costs and moving costs are covered by the project budget.
- Social assistance is needs-based and without coercion.

Housing First Austria: facts & figures

- Implementation in 2 iterations:
 - "arriving home": April 2021 April 2023 (5.2 Mio. EUR)
 - housing first austria: May 2023 September 2024 (6.6 Mio. EUR)
- 566 homes have been allocated and 1.146 people live in a new apartment.
- 63% of adult tenants are women and 40% of beneficiaries are minors.
- Until September 2024, another 1.000 new Housing First units will be provided to people experiencing homelessness.
