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Economic Empowerment - a key theme in the literature

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Evidence: Context and culture matter, no overall consistency.

## **Bargaining/Empowerment**

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#### **Coercive Control**

**Economic abuse** – forcing financial dependence - a **core tactic** by VAW perpetrators for **establishing power** in relationships.





#### Growth in violence against women feared as recession hits



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
**Question**: Impact of unemployment on VAW at **population level** or in households **affected by job loss**?

→ Different data requirements and different policy implications!

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
Figure 1: Unemployment rates by gender and age-group 2004-2011.



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Figure 2: Change in unemployment rate 2004-2011 by PFA.



Evidence at the **population level** (using the British Crime Survey) supported the **bargaining/empowerment** hypothesis.

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
## Job Displacement, Unemployment Benefits and Domestic Violence

Sonia Bhalotra, Diogo G. C. Britto, Paolo Pinotti, Breno Sampaio

Bhalotra et al. [2021] merge Brazilian employer-employee and social welfare registers with data on VAW cases brought to criminal courts, 2009-2018, and job losses due to "mass layoffs".


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**Figure 3:** The effect of male and female job loss on domestic violence, judicial suits

Attribute to job losses  $\rightarrow$  negative income shocks and "exposure".

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## **Policy Implications**

Should be more **concerned specifically for households that experience job losses** than VAW incidence effects in the wider population.

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#### Where Data Can Help

But we would **need more data and evidence** – more countries, alt. VAW measures – on the **VAW effect in households affected by job losses**.

Adams et al. [2024]: Women who later on will report VAW the policy reduce their labour supply/earnings right from the relationship's start (Finland).

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
